Project 236

Project 236 is an advocacy tool that can be used to understand the state of maternal and infant health in your legislative district! Advocates are encouraged to use this tool to speak with their legislators about comprehensive policy changes. Statistics based on county-level data for all of Georgia's 236 districts on

- Preterm birth
- Low birthweight delivery
- Infant mortality rate
- Rates of inadequate prenatal care

How to Use Project 236 in Advocacy

How does your district compare to the state of Georgia overall? Is there an area where your Senate district is performing lower? Speak with your Senator about how comprehensive policies can address negative outcomes. Does your House district have outcomes that are better than the state of Georgia? Talk with your Representative about what they can do to make sure it stays that way or even improves.

Support the expansion and advocacy efforts of the perinatal workforce in our state.



- Support Doula Medicaid Reimbursement and provide a safety net fund for prenatal, birth, and postpartum doula services.
- Increase access to legislative process for doulas and midwives.

Increase access to adequate oral healthcare for pregnant women.



- Reduce pregnancy discrimination in oral health care.
- · Increase provider knowledge about oral health care for pregnant and postpartum people.
- Extend Medicaid to include oral health codes for pregnant people up to 12 months postpartum.

WHY ORAL HEALTH CARE?

Poor oral healthcare can result in pregnant persons experiencing premature delivery, low birth weight, pre-eclampsia, pregnancy tumors, and tooth decay.

Improve the physical and mental health and wellness of pregnant and postpartum people.



- Increase representation of maternal mental health in all mental health and substance abuse discussions and policies.
- Increase reimbursements for pregnancy related or associated mental health conditions.
- Expand prenatal and postpartum screening, education, and direct maternal mental health services.
- Address and reduce maternal substance abuse and intimate partner violence.
